Cameron was disappointed when the D1 opportunities didn't materialize, but he had some great D3 options and we are thrilled with OXY. He really liked the staff and connected well with the players on his visit. They graduate a 4yr starter at QB who set school and conference all-time passing records, so the job is wide open for competition next Fall! Being close to AZ is nice so we can make games, but he's also far enough away to start being his own man. We have lots of friends in LA, so he will have some watchful eyes and home cooked meals if needed while away from home!

Overall, Cameron rallied over \$500,000 in merit scholarships from the schools he was accepted to for next Fall. The range was from \$8,000 (ASU) to \$35,000 (Ohio Wesleyan). OXY initially didn't offer a merit package, but Cam was their #1 recruit on the board and the coach made several calls to the financial aid office on our behalf! I even made a few calls to a few OXY alums I know (one being the NFL writer for the LA Times) and both called the AD in support. We ended up with a \$20,000/yr package for all 4 years, which is certainly a nice chunk off a \$65,000 price tag! He has some other scholarships he has applied for that will be announced by June, so maybe there will be a little more "help" on the way!

He will graduate with Cum Laude honors and the respect of many in the Notre Dame Prep community that know his D1 football opportunities were severely compromised by his head coach, yet he stayed committed to finish what he started 4 years ago. We are proud of him and excited for this next chapter at OXY. Who knows, maybe he lights it up as a Frosh and some D1 school comes calling!


